Owners, Masters, Managers and Representatives of Ships under the Cyprus flag and of Passenger Ships under any flag entering Cyprus Ports The Cyprus Shipping Association

Subject: <u>Directive 2005/33/EC amending Council Directive 1999/32/EC relating to a reduction in the sulphur content of certain liquid fuels</u>

I wish to inform you that on 06.07.2005, the European Parliament and the Council issued Directive 2005/33/EC amending Directive 1999/32/EC and your attention is drawn to the following:

- 1. Article 4a.1 of Directive 1999/32/EC as amended by Directive 2005/33/EC (hereinafter cited together as "the Directive") provides that Member States shall take all necessary measures to ensure that marine fuels are not used in the areas of their territorial seas, exclusive economic zones and pollution control zones falling within SOx Emission Control Areas, if the sulphur content of those fuels exceeds 1,5 % by mass. This shall apply to all vessels of all flags, including vessels whose journey began outside the Community.
- 2. Pursuant to Article 4a.2 of the Directive, the application dates for the aforementioned shall be as follows:
  - (a) for the Baltic Sea area referred to in regulation 14(3)(a) of Annex VI to MARPOL, 11 August 2006;
  - (b) for the North Sea: 12 months after entry into force of the IMO designation, according to established procedures, or 11 August 2007, whichever is the earlier;
- 3. Furthermore, Article 4a.4 of the Directive provides that as from 11 August 2006, Member States shall take all necessary measures to ensure that marine fuels are not used in their territorial seas, exclusive economic zones and pollution control zones by passenger ships operating on regular services to or from any Community port, if the sulphur content of those fuels exceeds 1,5 % by mass. Member States shall be responsible for the enforcement of this requirement at least in respect of vessels flying their flag and vessels of all flags while in their ports.

4. Pursuant to Article 4a.5 of the Directive, as from **11 August 2006**, Member States shall require the correct completion of ships' logbooks, including fuel-changeover operations, as a condition of the ships' entry into Community ports.

To this effect the Owners, Masters, Managers and Representatives of ships under the Cyprus flag and of passenger ships of all flags operating on regular services in Cyprus and other community ports, are hereby requested to comply with all relevant provisions of the Directive.
